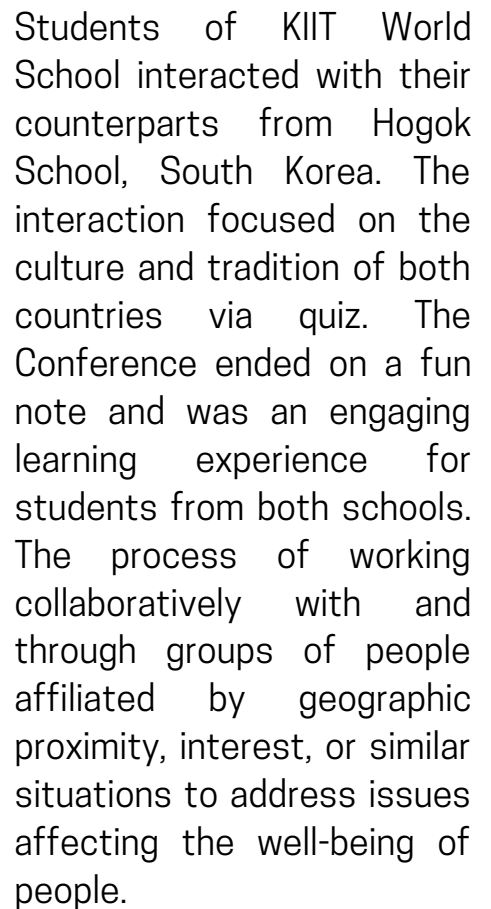

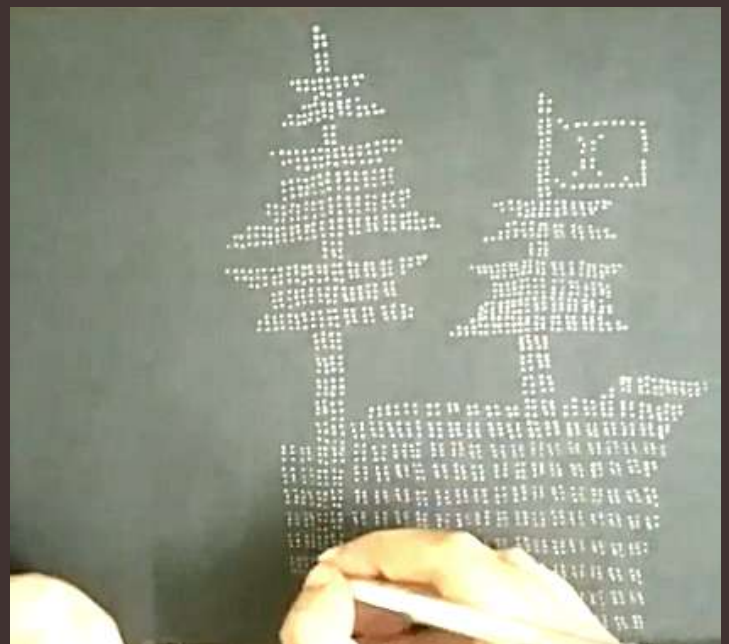


Global Family Day

A masterpiece painting labelled as 'The Garden of Earthly Delights' by Hieronymus Bosch had 3 panels...The first panel portrayed the birth of humans, animals, and religious places...The second panel portrayed the time when corruption, evils started infusing their way...Overpopulation, crimes, injustice, inhumanity, etc...The last panel was the most alarming, frightening, and dreadful. It portrayed the end of the living race due to the excessive exploitation of resources.

The perspective is crooked and collapsed. It showed a burnt paradise. The 2030 agenda for sustainable development was adopted by all United Nation member states in 2015. These goals share a blueprint for peace, prosperity and the welfare of the economy and the future of the planet. These 17 goals recognise ending poverty, malnutrition, and hunger and other strategies that must go hand in hand like climate action, good hygiene that is clean water, sanitation, shelter, etc...These goals also acknowledge decent work and economic growth, affordable and clean energy, etc.



The 2030 agenda also ensures a safe and secure future for mother earth, life on land and life below the water...The goals promise equality, peace, and justice and for further growth, the goals provide promising quality education and good health and wellbeing...But, a country's well-being is defined by the health of the inhabitants. In that case, clean water and sanitation play a crucial part. One of the 2030 goals is to improve water quality by reducing pollution and

eliminating the dumping of waste and hazardous chemicals in water bodies which results in water contamination. It is to reduce the fraction of wastewater and reuse it for other motives. A major challenge confronted by India's government to achieve this goal is poverty. Which is a consequence of the high population and unemployment. Unequal distribution of resources is another factor. Pursuing this further another reason is the economic fund of India since it is a developing country. Poor drainage systems

and clogged drains is an additional factor. Lack of awareness and education amongst the common masses leads to badly taken decisions. Such factors lead to impurity of water and poor sanitation facilities. As a consequence, we face water scarcity, waterborne and other diseases, poor living conditions for marine life, disappearing wetland, damaging of the ecosystem, increased death rates, and interrupted growth.

The measures taken by the government to promote clean water and sanitation to the public are initiated projects like the Jalshakti Abhiyaan, Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojna, and Watershed development project. But as they say each one can make a difference so here are few steps we can take as individuals in order to achieve this goal by 2030. Looking in taps should be taken care of. Instead of hose use brooms to clean sidewalks and waste of water should be avoided. In the final analysis, the world is in our hands and we have to conserve and protect it.

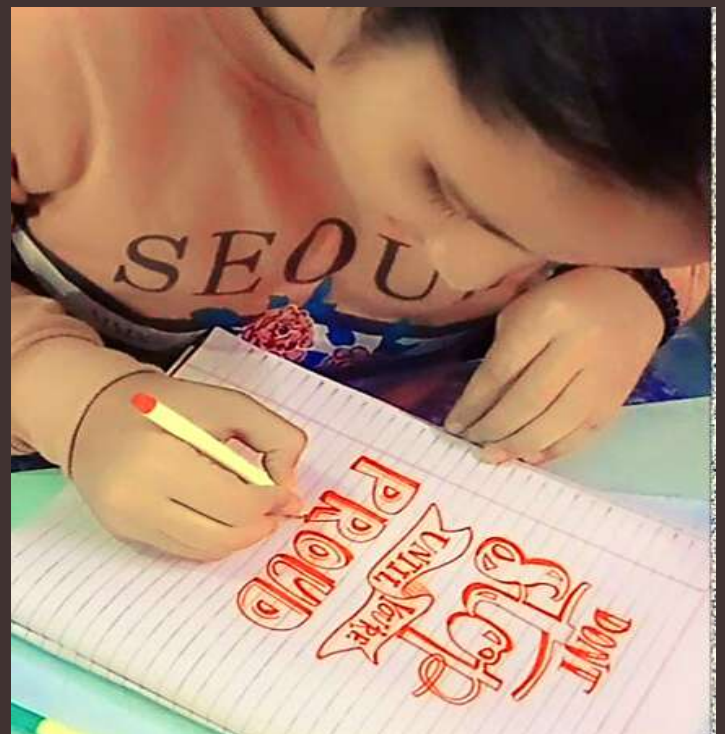


Building Confidence

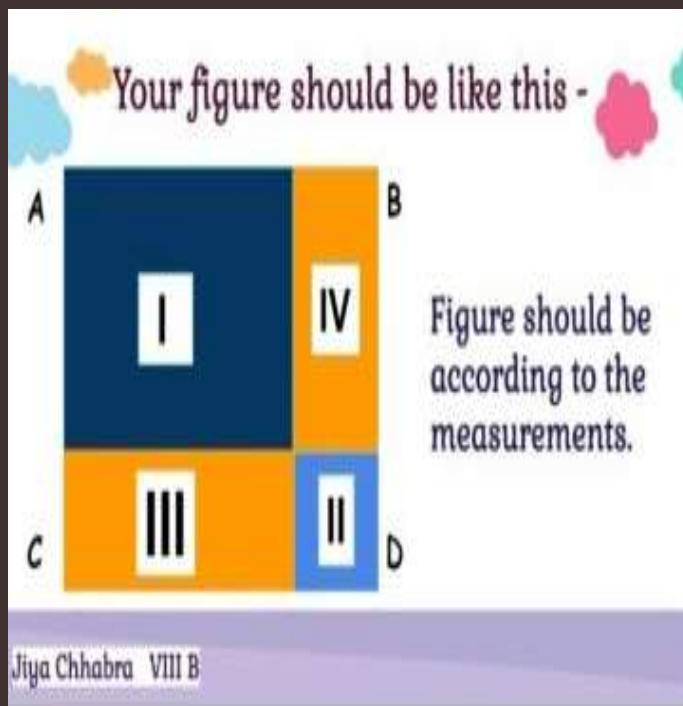

Formulae Derivation

Students derived the formulae for calculating the volume of various 3D Shapes on their own using real-life objects. They measured the dimensions of the objects and calculated their areas respectively. They were asked to make mini models of a cylinder and a cone of the same height and radius and hence verify whether the volume of a cone is one-third of the cylinder or not. Students created the mini models and then put flour or rice in the cone and poured it thrice in the cylinder.

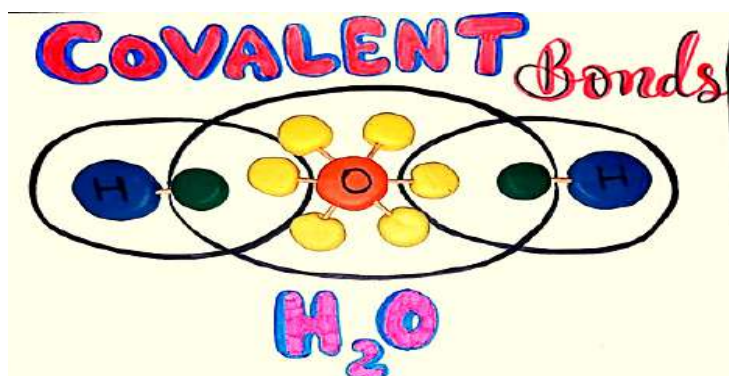
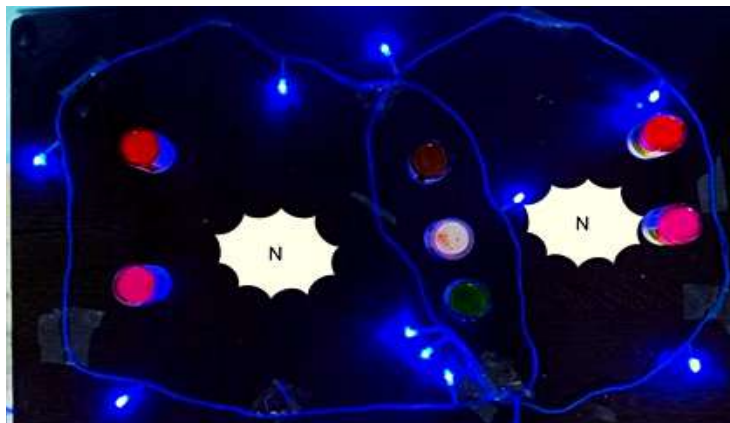


Hands on Learning

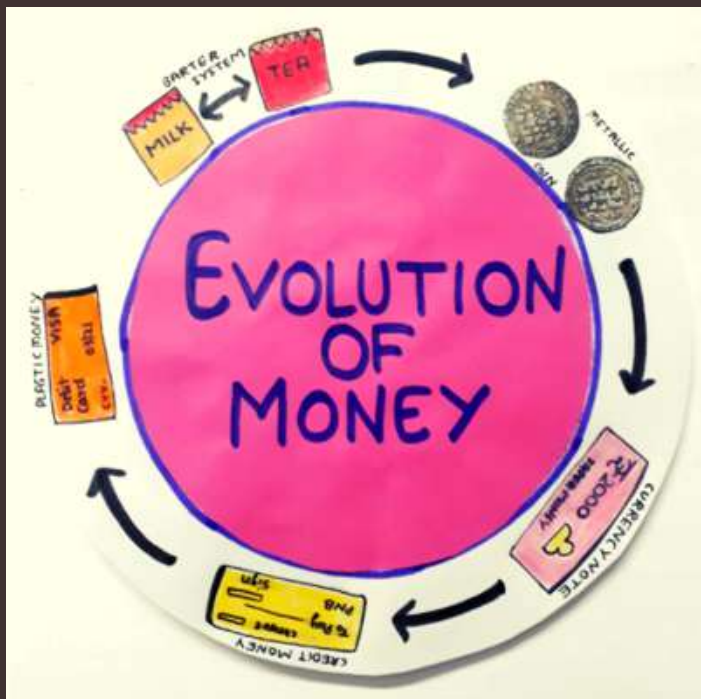

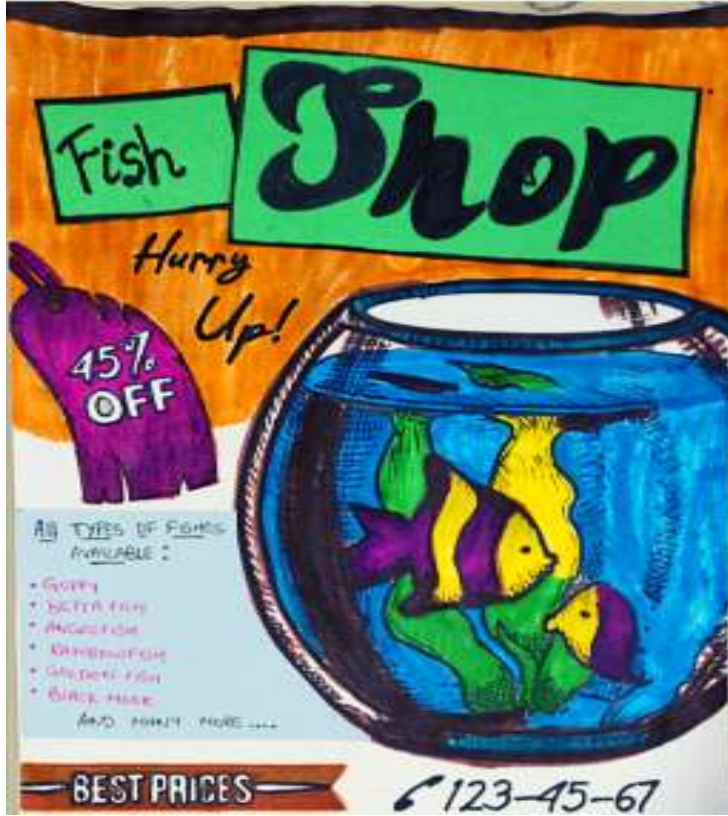


Money and Credit

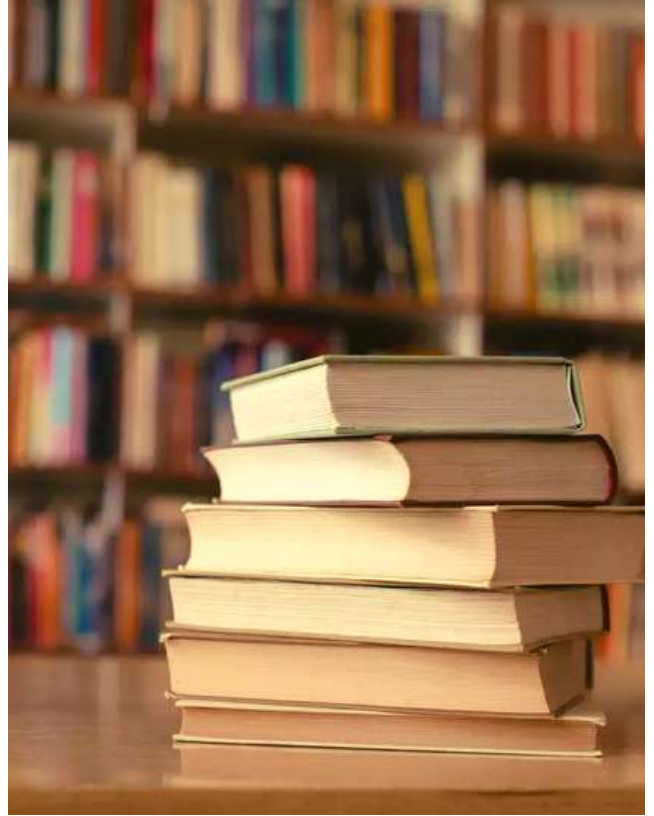


Library

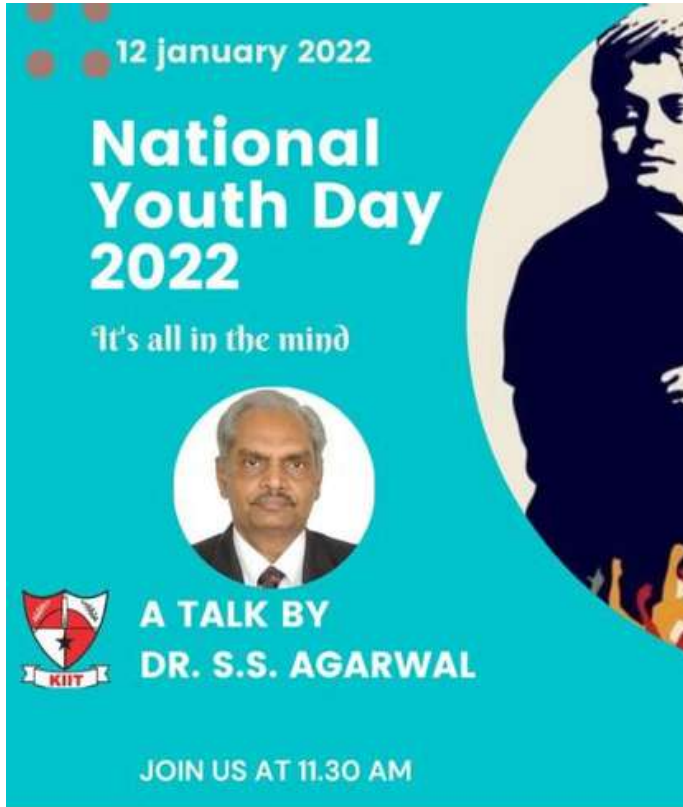
Civic Participation

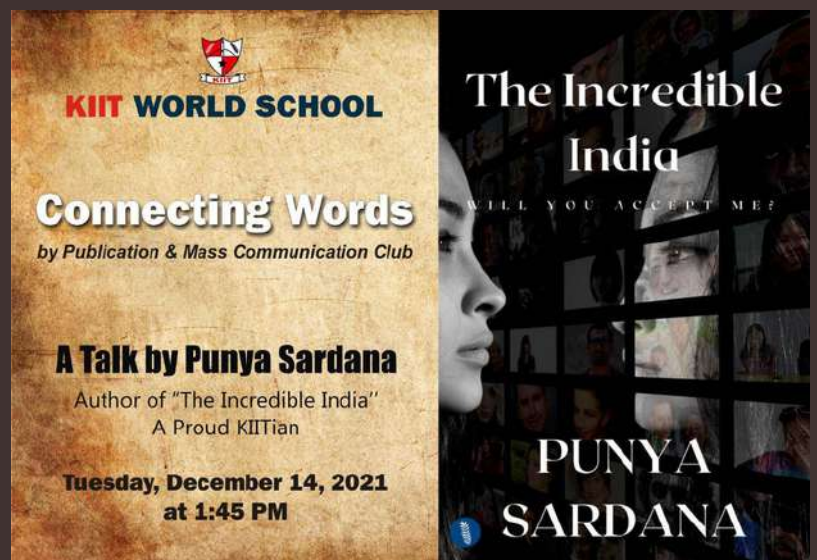


It's All in the Mind

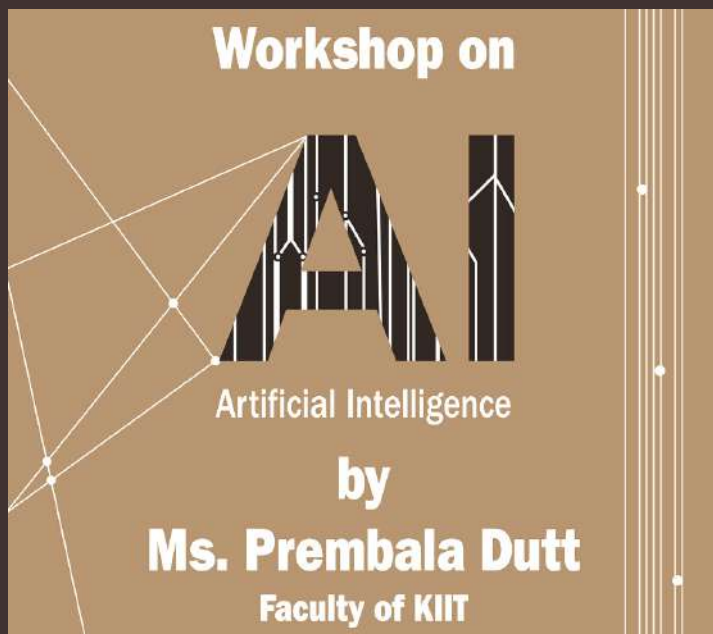

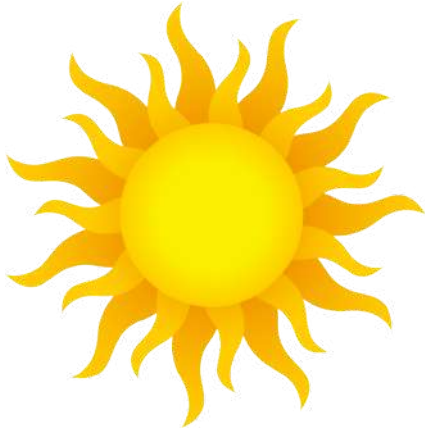
