The chapter was based on "MINING THE SKILLS-NEW NORMAL FOR EDUCATION". The key focus was on strategising the learning techniques keeping in mind the current scenarios of new normal.

Introduction to Laws of Light

Students performed an activity and verified the law of reflection and refraction, by using various materials like mirror, pencil, container, coloured sheet, etc. They learned that reflection is the bouncing back of light when it strikes a smooth surface whereas refraction is the bending of light rays, when it travels from one medium to another.

Students brought food samples like raw and cooked potato, rice, milk, curd, cheese, etc. One representative from each Quality Circle performed the experiment by adding a few drops of iodine solution in the test-tube. The change in colour of solution to blue confirmed the presence of starch.

ATL Innovation – Smart Blind Stick



"Technology, like art, is a soaring exercise of the human imagination."

A prototype was prepared by two students Krrish Bansal and Nakul Mittal of class XII-A. They created a smart blind stick that can be used to avoid colliding with obstacles. It uses ultrasonic sensors to detect the depth below or the obstacle in between. Bluetooth interface between the controller and smartphone is introduced to make it easier for visually impaired people. It detects the distance from the obstacle and sends it to the controller. The device is portable, efficient, pocket friendly, futuristic and consumes lesser power.

Smart Traffic Light



A system of smart traffic lights was designed by Manit Vig of Class XII that use cameras and AI to record the traffic flow and if any violations of traffic rules are observed. The cameras that are already installed to monitor traffic violations are used for this purpose.

The system uses computer vision and deep learning classifiers to identify and count the vehicles in front of the traffic lights. This gathers data regarding how many cars stand in front of the traffic signals while it is read and how many pass through while it is green. The averages of these datasets can give us the traffic density a signal is catering to at any point during the day. The algorithm then uses the ratios of these averages to calculate the appropriate Time period for the traffic light. Longer green signals if more traffic is present and vice versa, some upper and lower bounds are in place to avoid Time period becoming zero. This allows for the traffic light to adjust according to the traffic conditions in almost real-time, saving people's time and fuel.

He liked my spectacles more than I do, but I guess that could have at least waited till I reach home. Be very aware of the monkeys! well, there are many here and most of them are trained as well.
