**Coping with exam stress & lessons in the journey**

What should you do about the tension, the anxiety of examinations

and all the pressure that comes along with them? Some tension is inevitable; to manage it, manage those very thoughts and manage your responses. Focus yourself on the thoughts you hold, and the actions that you can take in the moment. Remind yourself of what you are doing to beat those fears. Lesson two is to do what you can control, to do what is actionable. As you manage yourself better, you will prepare yourself for all the times you put yourself face to face with a larger goal, heart racing and adrenaline up, with the accompanying

stress. Exams, above all, teach us one to set meaningful goals and think big on the way to achieving big.

**What happens after exams are over!**

So, when you have exams, think about life beyond exams - powered, strengthened and improved by the learning during exams. It teaches you so many things beyond academics. Exams are not testing you. Rather, you are using exams to prepare yourself for growth and achievement in every phase of life. Did you learn reflection and discipline, discover your own strength and resilience, and find drive and ambition in the process? If so, that mid-session or final exam set you on the road to success.

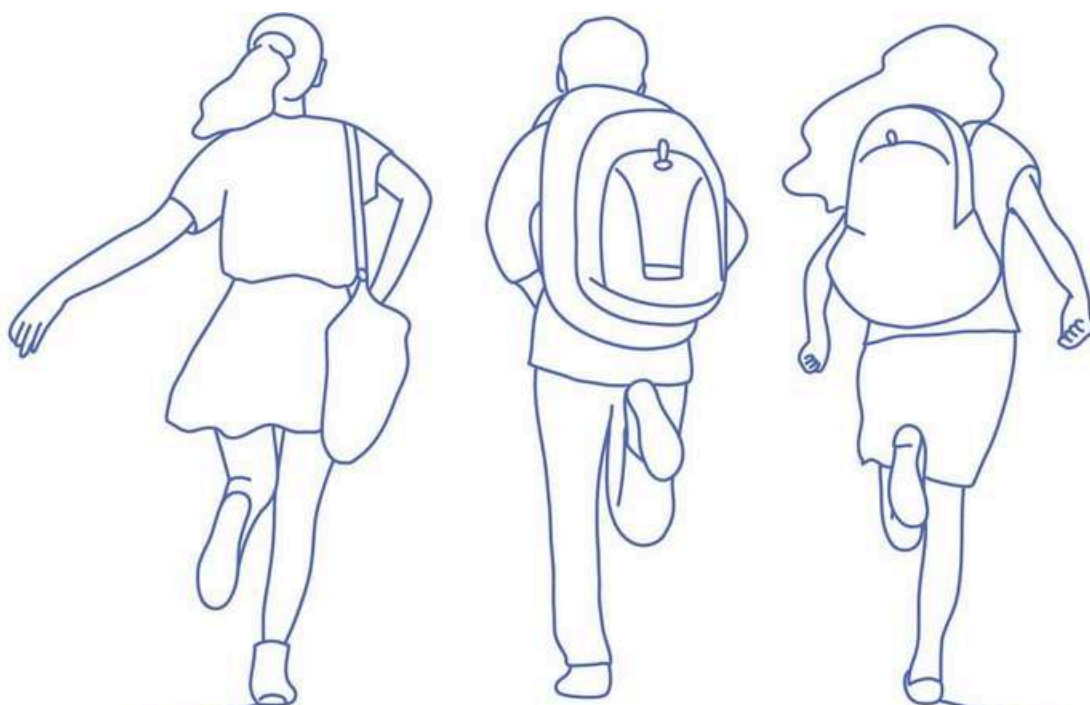
